

Prescribing Hints & Tips January 2025

HORMONE REPLACEMENT THERAPY (HRT) TO BE PRESCRIBED ON SEPARATE SCRIPTS TO OTHER ITEMS

Healthcare professionals are reminded that HRT items need to be prescribed on separate scripts to other items if patients are to use a HRT prescription pre-payment certificate. If a script is written containing both HRT and other items, the patient will need to pay for all the items, and then claim back a refund for the HRT. Please see here for more info.

DERMOL® PRESCRIBING

Dermol® 500 lotion and dermol® cream <u>are restricted for use</u> only in confirmed staphylococcal infection e.g. Recurrent folliculitis and impetiginised eczema. Use of emollients with anti-microbial ingredients should be discouraged where not indicated; please see the <u>Nottinghamshire emollient formulary</u> for suitable non-antimicrobial alternatives. In addition, the use of anti-bacterial emollients as leave on products can cause irritant dermatitis.
