Nottinghamshire County Council Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment

Section 128A of the National Health Service Act 2006, (NHS Act 2006) requires each Health and Wellbeing board to assess the need for pharmaceutical services in its area and to publish a statement of its assessment – the Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment.

Nottingham County Council have commenced work on the Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment and as part of this have a short survey for the pharmacy owner or main pharmacist to fill out which can be accessed on this link here; Nottinghamshire County Health and Wellbeing Board Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment (PNA) 2025 Pharmacy Contractor Questionnaire - Nottinghamshire County Council - Citizen Space. The survey closes on 12th January 2025.

Antiviral Medicines Against Influenza

The Department of Health and Social Care has notified via the Central Alerting system, (CAS) that flu levels are increasing in the Community, so that prescribers in primary care may now prescribe and Community Pharmacists may now supply oseltamivir and Zanamivir for prophylaxis and treatment of flu on NHS prescriptions. Community Pharmacies, especially those supplying care homes, may wish to consider keeping some oseltamivir and zanamivir in stock so that patients can start taking the medication as soon as possible and within the time periods given in the CAS alert attachment.



Original Pack Dispensing

Emergency Hormonal Contraception Community Pharmacy Tender in Nottinghamshire County

Nottinghamshire County Council is recommissioning Emergency Hormonal Contraceptive (EHC) service provision, within community pharmacy, from April 2025. This recommissioning is in response to national procurement changes, which will affect the way that healthcare services are procured.

EHC provision within community pharmacy is considered as an important part of the sexual health system. It offers timely access to contraception and sexual health advice in order to contribute to reducing unplanned pregnancies, particularly for those at greatest risk of adverse sexual health outcomes. Community pharmacies are conveniently located in the heart of communities, with long opening hours and trained clinical staff who reflect the diversity of their communities.

Public health commissioners have worked closely with community pharmacies and the Local Pharmaceutical Committee and have increased the consultation fee to £15 and have streamlined the service specification to reduce the requirement to sign lots of documentation.

The new specification integrates the EHC offer with the contraceptive element of the Pharmacy First Service. Providing oral contraceptives during an EHC consultation ensures immediate access to a more sustainable and ongoing form of contraceptive. Pharmacies will also be able to opt into an additional condom delivery service (Component B) to make the most of the opportunity to offer under 25-year-olds free condoms at the end of an EHC consultation.

The new contract will be for a period of three plus two (3+2) years. To sign up to this service, pharmacies must register at this website www.eastmidstenders.org and register an interest in the service using this link: Supply of Emergency Hormonal Contraception by Tuesday 28th February 2025.



Prescribing Hint and Tips Newsletter

- Information about an error in liquid dosage following a change in product due
 to a shortage and a link to the local guidance "Principles when prescribing and
 switching liquid medication preparations and strengths". A direct link to this

- Repeat prescriptions for Mounjaro® (tirzepatide) kwikpen® should usually be for one pen only as a pen contains 4 doses i.e. 28 days' supply.

ADHD Medication Shortages

Due to ongoing ADHD medication shortages, there is local guidance which can be viewed through the following links:

This guidance includes the following recommendations:

- 12-hour Prolonged-Release Methylphenidate tablets and Lisdexamfetamine capsules can be prescribed generically.
- 8-hour Modified-Release Methylphenidate capsules, however, MUST be
 prescribed and dispensed by brand due to differences in their release
 profiles. Please do not ask the prescriber to issue a generic prescription for 8-hour Modified-Release Methylphenidate capsules. Instead, it would be helpful
 to inform the prescriber of the available brand so the prescription can be
 amended accordingly.
